Webcast: A video broadcast of an event transmitted over the internet. A webcast has traditionally been a one-way push of content from an event to anyone that has the link to watch online	Webinar: An online meeting or presentation held via the internet in real-time. The main feature of live webinars is interactivity or the ability to discuss, send, and receive information in real-time	Video Conference: The holding of a conference among people at remote locations by means of transmitted audio and video signals.	Chat Room: A chat room platform that participants can use to communicate with each other via text (no video component).	Pre-Recorded Video: A video that is played live but was previously recorded.
